
We know that you have gifts to offer us and we are eager to put them to use.

Faith Formation

It is the task of catechesis to show who Jesus Christ is, his life and ministry and to present the Christian faith. We are committed to teaching the Gospel values of Jesus Christ and encourage response to the Holy Spirit through the development of a vital, ongoing relationship with God, our Creator. We emphasize the development of adult and family spirituality, as it is in the adult Christian community that faith is modeled and shared leading to the formation of children and youth.

Faith Formation Registration

Registration for children and teen programs begins in April for the upcoming academic year. Registration, volunteer and informational forms are available in the Faith Formation Office and online at sjtw.net.

Sunday School: Sunday Mornings

This program serves children ages 3, 4 and 5/Kindergarten with classes that capture their imagination and interest through Bible stories, music and art experiences. Annual sessions run from late September through April.

Elementary Faith Formation: Tuesday and Wednesday Evenings

Several opportunities are available for families with children in Grades 1 through 6. On-site, weekly Faith Formation classes are held Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, September through April. There is also a Faith Alive In The Home (FAITH) option available for families.

Junior High Faith Formation: Wednesday Evening

Junior High programming offers lessons in social justice components of our faith such as 'The Hunger Meal' and 'Scavenger Hunt for Food'. Events are offered in the form of retreats, our Summer Stretch Program and Mayhem Lock-In. The FAITH (at home option) is also open to students in grades 7 & 8.

ONEWITH High School Faith Formation – (Grades 9, 10 & 11) Sunday Evenings

ONEWITH is an innovative liturgy and Scripture-centered curriculum using the Mass as our model. Not only will this new format enable our youth to participate in and learn about Catholic liturgy from the inside out, it will enable all of our youth (grades 9-11) to participate on the same night (no more split sessions)! Opportunities include peer ministry, service projects, mission trips, retreat experiences and recreation events.

Centering Prayer

This group meets every 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month, 10:00- 11:00 a.m., Library. Anyone is welcome. New participants simply come and relax in prayer. Facilitators guide the group.

Parish Life and Adult Enrichment

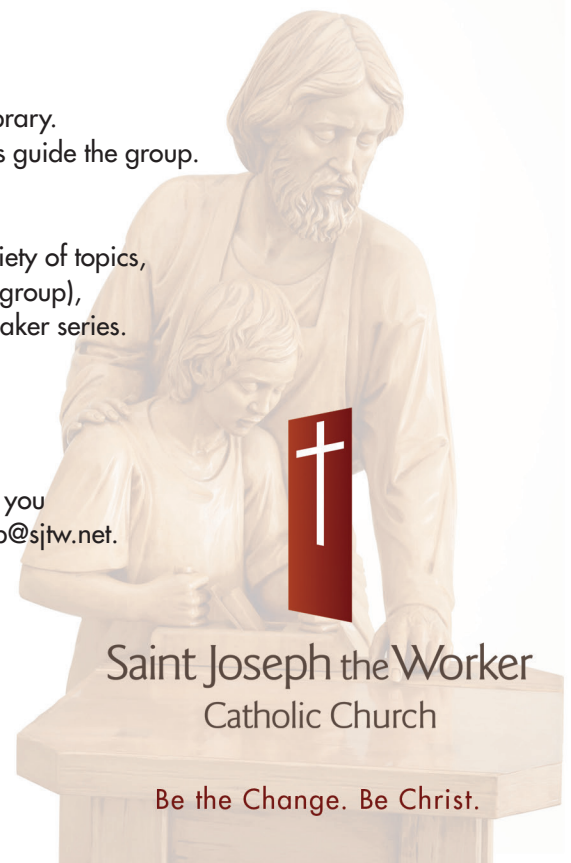

Pastoral Ministry

Pastoral Ministry is bringing Christ's compassion to people in emotional, mental physical and spiritual need, as well as helping others to recognize their gifts and empowering them to use these gifts in the service of others.

Pastoral Ministry Board

Seeks to promote a welcoming Faith Community that cares for all and empowers people to assist in bringing Christ's healing to people through people, "Carrying one another's burdens..." (Galatians 6:2). The Pastoral Ministry Board invites anyone 16 years of age and older to attend our open meetings. Call ahead to add any topic to our agenda.

Prayer Line

The prayer of the entire Faith community is important, so we encourage anyone with special needs to call the parish and request prayers. There is also a book of prayer requests on the podium in the Gathering Space and Prayer Corner of the Worship Space to write your individual prayer intentions. Funeral Luncheon Ministry

Parishioners prepare and serve and cleanup meals for funerals in two teams from approximately 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Volunteers also donate salads and desserts.

Pastoral Care Ministers

These Ministers are parishioners who have been trained in either Stephen Ministry or BeFrienders. Pastoral Care Ministers are available to walk confidently with anyone needing support for a time.

Social Hour

This is an opportunity for our community to welcome newcomers and to embrace members of our parish community with shared conversation, coffee and donuts after weekend Liturgies.

Homebound Eucharistic Ministry

Homebound and hospitalized parishioners may arrange for an individual reception of the Eucharist.

Gadabouts

This group welcomes anyone 55 and over to join their faith-filled group that gathers monthly for an activity. Since 1992, Senior parishioners have prayed, socialized and enjoyed one another's friendship while sightseeing or visiting religious or historical places.

Angel Quilters

Angel Quilters meet the second and fourth Tuesday of each month to prepare and tie quilts for the homeless. Women of all ages are invited to work on this project.

Support Groups

Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), Depression Bipolar Support Alliance (DBSA) and Down Syndrom Parent Group are available at SJTW. The bulletin and website have dates and times of meetings.

Counseling

Information and references for professional help are available from the Pastoral Ministry Office.

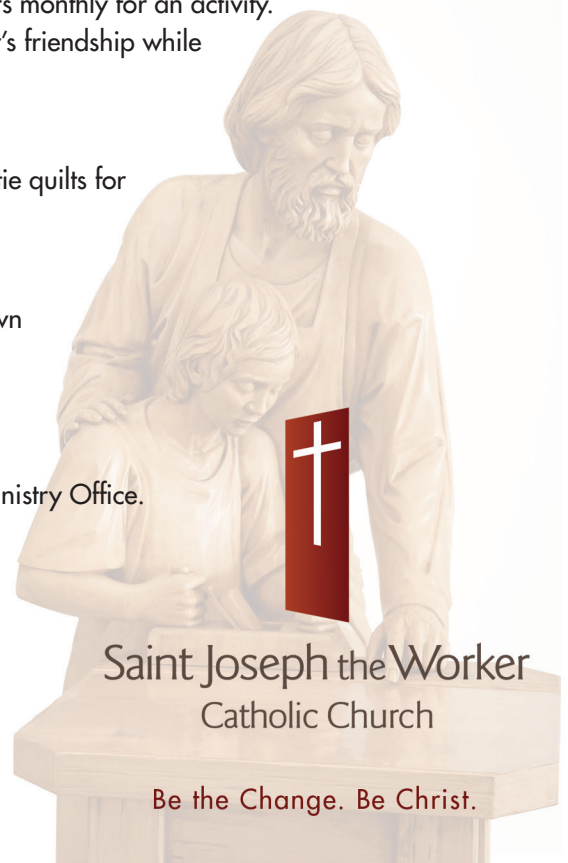

Sacramental Life

Preparation for, and celebration of Sacraments, is a pillar of Catholic faith life.

Baptism

Reconciliation and Eucharist

Preparation for elementary-age children occurs during the academic school year. These Sacrament preparation programs include a parent meeting and parent/child gatherings to enrich the preparation. Materials are provided and families accomplish lessons at home. Reconciliation celebrations occur in November. First Eucharist celebrations occur on designated weekends following Easter. Anointing of the Sick

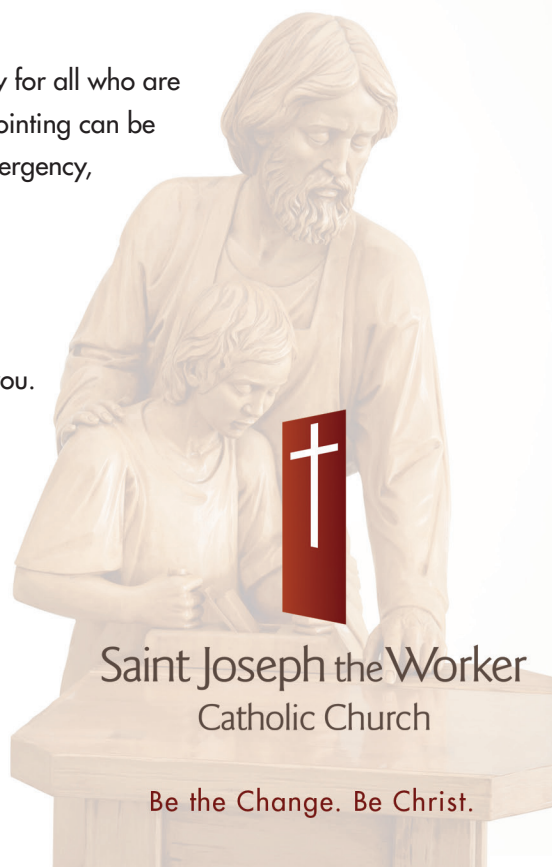

Social Justice

Our mission is to be a community where Catholic social teaching and ministry are central and integral, not fringe and optional, and where Social Justice is lived by every member of the Body of Christ.

Habitat for Humanity

The Northwest Churches Coalition provides people-power to homes being built by Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity in the North-western suburban area. Since 1990, our faith-based communities have annually provided hundreds of parishioners to a Habitat "Workcamp Site" for two weeks each summer. No construction experience required. Volunteers are also needed for support roles, such as serving as a site host, preparing and delivering lunches.

Housing for All

We are part of a collaboration of Northwest area churches & organizations working together for safe, decent, affordable housing for families of all incomes. This group meets monthly at SJTW and is actively working to ensure housing for all in our community.

C.R.O.S.S. Food Shelf & Assistance

C.R.O.S.S. (Christians Reaching Out in Social Service) is more than 20 area churches working together to try and reach out to the needs of the hurting in our local community. They distribute food, clothing, financial assistance and other essentials as available to them. You can help by donating food or assisting at the food shelf. C.R.O.S.S. is open Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Food donations can be placed in baskets in the Gathering Area & Faith Formation Gathering Space.

Families Moving Forward

SJTW is part of a network of churches that hosts families who are homeless overnight for two weeks annually each summer at the parish. We provide hospitality, dinner, evening activities and breakfast for three to five families.

Thanksgiving and Christmas Outreach

As a parish, we reach out to families within and outside our parish for Christmas and Thanksgiving, providing baskets of food, gifts and giftcards.

A Community Caring for Life (ACCL)

We want to support any woman in crisis pregnancy. We partner with North Side Life Care Center in North Minneapolis, WomenSource in Anoka and Robbinsdale Women's Center in Robbinsdale. We hold these women in prayer.

Angel Network

Sometimes our family and close friends cannot meet all of our daily needs to get us through a difficult time and we need assistance – SJTW Angel Network is willing to help! We believe we are called to serve and want to share the journey with you. Let us know your needs and we will try to help by supplying prepared meals, transportation, etc. This is an incredible volunteer opportunity that makes a difference.

Caring for Creation Action Team

To be good stewards of God's creation, we have formed an action team to address issues of global climate change.

Loaves & Fishes

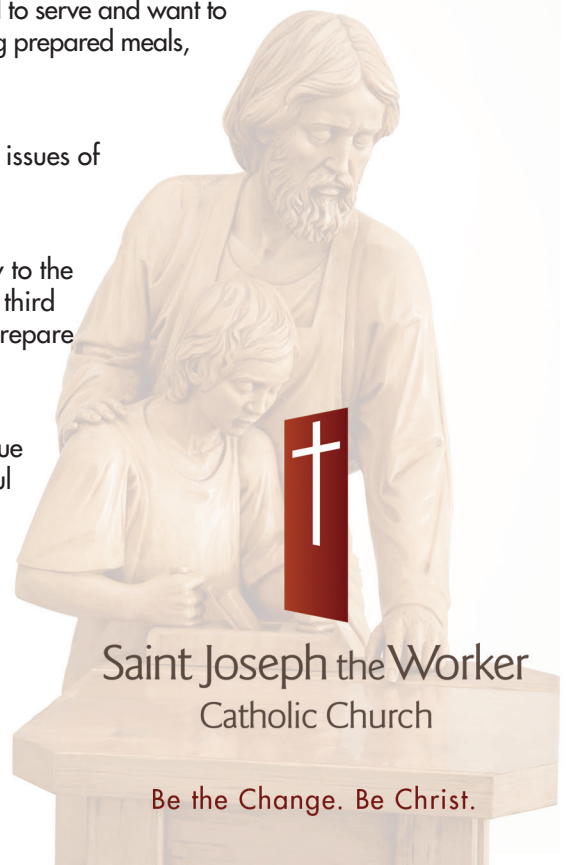
Loaves and Fishes is a care giving ministry providing meals and offering hospitality to the hungry. We serve an evening meal at Holy Rosary Church (South Minneapolis) the third Wednesday of January, March, May, July, September and November. Volunteers prepare and serve the food, in addition to helping clean up.

Domestic Violence Awareness & Action (DVAA)

The DVAA ministry works within the parish to raise the level of awareness about the issue of domestic violence, send a message of zero tolerance for abuse and promote peaceful and safe home environments. In addition, DVAA works with other faith communities in our area in starting a DVAA ministry at their church, offering guidance, sharing of materials and resources and working together on projects.

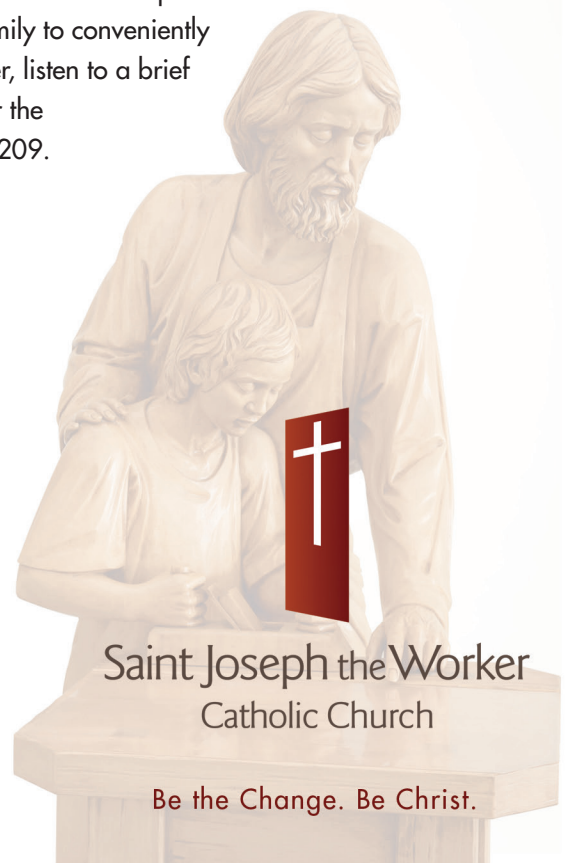

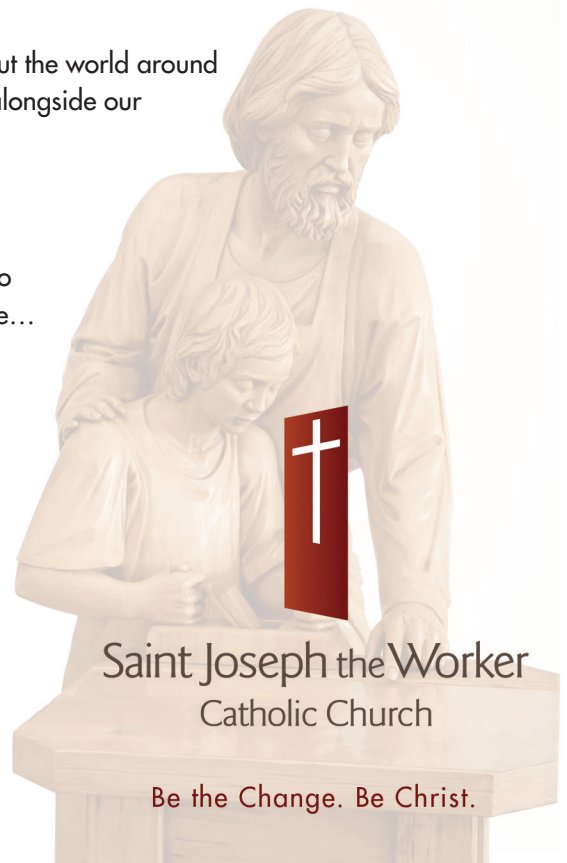

We request that all who choose automatic contributions complete an offertory commitment form and return it as a sign of your shared responsibility.

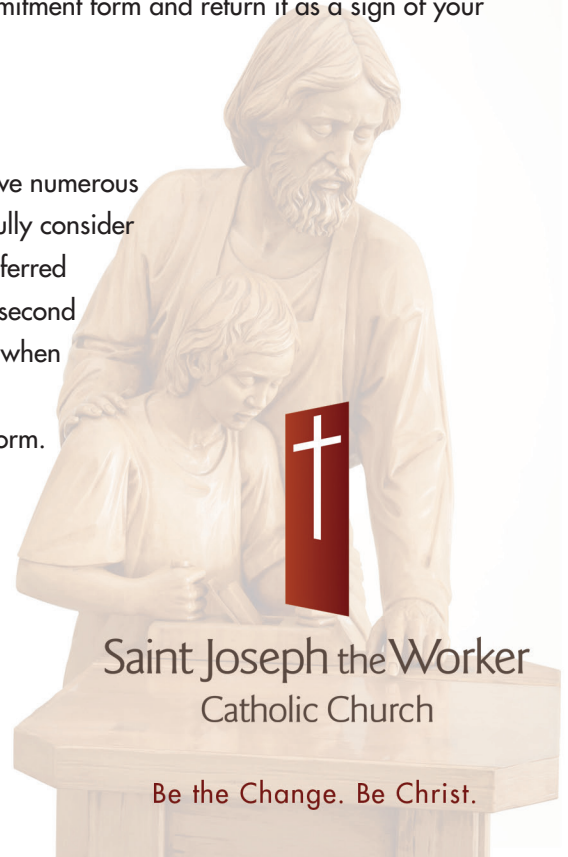
Stewardship of Time & Talent

Knights of Columbus Council #13359

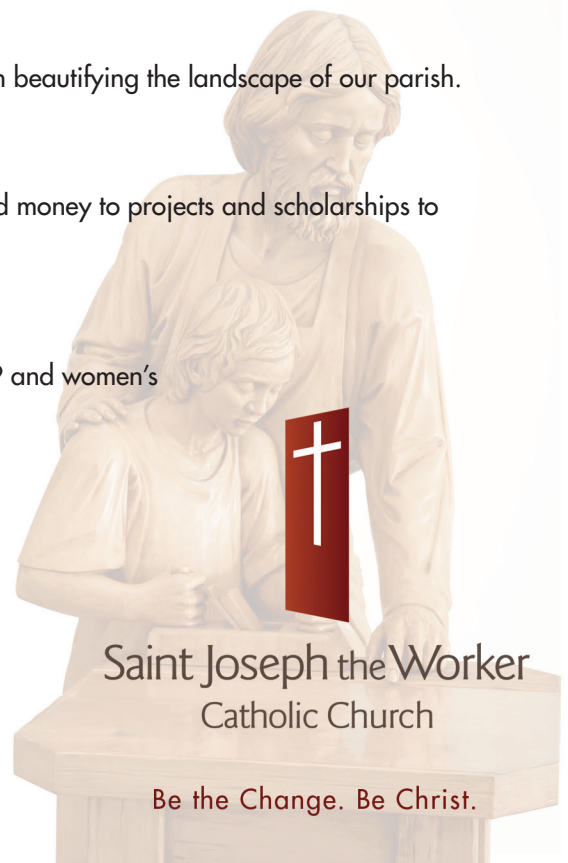
The SJTW KCs was formed in 2002 by men of the SJTW parish. They give time and money to projects and scholarships to students.

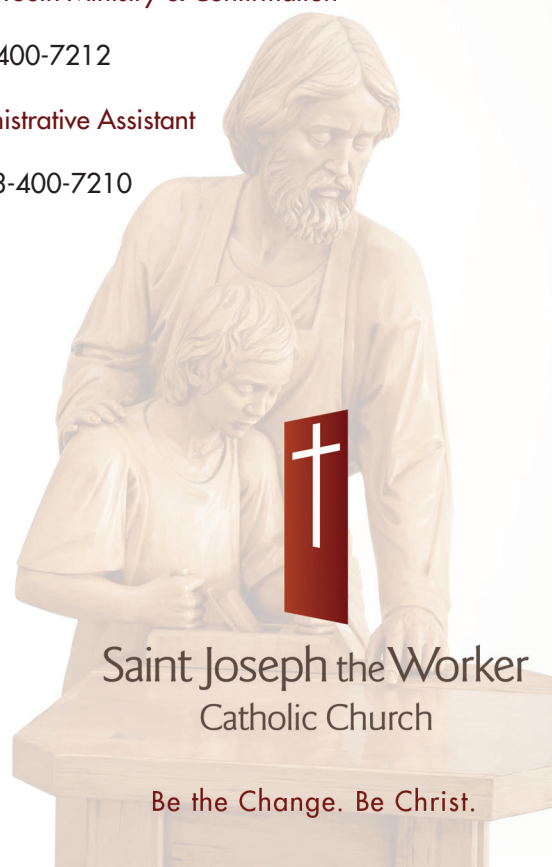

Haiti Sister Parish

St. Joseph the Worker & Sainte Catherine d'Alexandre – A Haiti Sister Parish Relationship since January 2009

"Sa je pa wè, kè pa tounen." *"What the eye doesn't see doesn't move the heart."* - Haitian Proverb

Reflection by Bonnie Steele: A great temptation in traveling to Haiti is to come as helpers and rescuers and to see the people as something wholly other—and not like us. While service is important, the overarching goal of our relationship is to see the people of Haiti, seeing them not only with physical eyes but also with the eyes of our heart and with the eyes of God, to see their humanity, and to appreciate and see Christ in them. Our Haitian sisters and brothers have something to give each one of us, something we have yet to discover. In this light, we ask, what are we called to as a community? We seek to live out our faith in mutual relationship with the community of Sainte Catherine d'Alexandre in Bouzy. Together, we ask ourselves, "What kind of relationship are we called to enter into with one another?" Together, we as communities must discover together what the Spirit has in mind for us, as the Spirit continues binding our hearts together in love and solidarity.

How you can get involved: We welcome all parishioners to be part of our ministry through projects, committees or helping with one-time events.

Medical Committee:

Join our efforts to support community-based health care in Bouzy, empowering Haitians to monitor and continue preventative healthcare measures and to treat simple illnesses and injuries.

Environmental Committee:

Be part of this interdisciplinary team supporting long-term projects for clean water, hygiene and access to electricity.

Education Committee:

Help our sister parish with improved learning tools, supporting existing schools with teacher training, supplies and books.

Communication:

Help share our experiences to the parish, including through e-news, the printed bulletin, website, Facebook and updating a shared calendar and managing our photos.

Events:

Assist with any of the following: Hospitality for our Haitian friends when they visit, Annual Fundraising Event, and collaborations with other ministries.

Trip & Planning Logistics:

Help plan air travel, transportation and translators for periodic trips to visit our sister parish.

Financial & Accounting:

Prepare quarterly summaries of income and expenses, reminders and thank you notes for donors.

French & Haitian Kreyol Translators:

Help translate for Haitian guests during visits, prepare our teams with basic Kreyol lessons before they travel and translate email communications.

Fundraising:

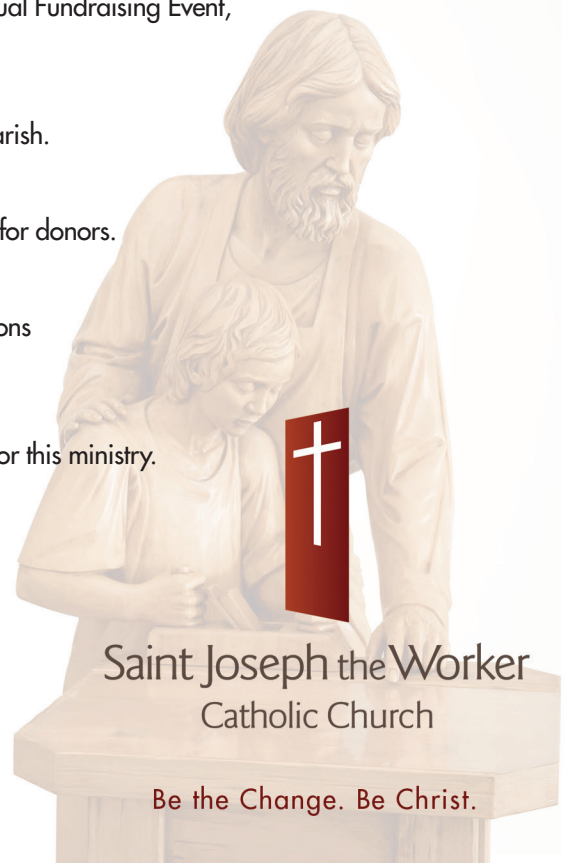
Creatively raising the necessary funds to grow our relationship and show our support for this ministry.
